Take an immediate right and cross over the overpass


Look for Leaksville-Spray Elementary School

Eta State and DKG International Scholarships Available

One of the benefits of Delta Kappa Gamma membership is the opportunity to recive scholarships for advanced degrees from both Eta State and DKG International.

Eta State sponsors \$4,000 academia scholarships for Doctoral and Sixth-Year graduate study, as well as smaller scholarships for either Master's level work requiring graduate school enrollment or non-degree activities, such as special projects, research, or certifications.

International awards up to 30 scholarships annually in the amount of \$6,000 for Master Degree candidates and \$10,000 for Doctoral Degree candidates. Last year, four Eta State sisters received International scholarships.

Those who have been DKG members for two calendar years or more are eligible to apply for Eta State Scholarships. Those who have been members for at least three years can also apply for International scholarships. Eta State members may apply for both an Eta State and an International Scholarship within a given vear.

To be considered, a member must complete and postmark Eta State and International scholarship application forms by February 1, 2014. Eta State scholarship application forms and a Checklist for Applicants for 2014 can be found on the state website under Scholarship Committee link. Contact Scholarship Chairman Nancy Griffin if you have questions.

The Initiation Committee chaired by Bonnie Brewer arranged the initiation ceremony in the church sanctuary. Guest Region VII Director Dr. Angela Kern participated in inducting Lynne Haynes into the DKG Society. After the meal, Dr. Kern who serves on the faculty of Pfeiffer University presented a program on nurturing new teachers. She led the chapter in completing an achievement project of filling gift bags with candy and notes of encouragement to her student teachers.

President Debbie Russell conducted the business meeting. The minutes were approved. Rachel Scott reported a balance of \$7007.34 in the treasury, with \$3172.97 Grant in Aid. The President recognized the member present with the most years of chapter membership, Hilda Purgason.
