 in your email address as your log on and click on "Forgot Password" to reset your password
 from delta01 to your password.
- Please remember that if you change your password, International will be unable to retrieve the new password. Try to use a password that is familiar to you.

Please make sure International has your correct email address. You can contact Virginia Pearson directly to confirm your email address and she can update it in the database. Her email is virgin-iap@dkg.org.

You can start a group or join a group that is already formed. This is a great way to join a book talk group.



Membership Pin

The gold key pin is inscribed with the Greek letters Delta Kappa Gamma, signifying key women teachers. The laurel wreath represents achievement. The cup signifies knowledge. The key is to be worn to official functions and meetings of the Society at local, state and international levels, and should always be worn as a pin.

The key pin is the emblem of membership in The Delta Kappa Gamma Society International. Members are expected to order the key pin immediately after initiation. The key pin is worn in a vertical position over the heart; international, state and chapter presidents' pins are worn directly below the key pin.

Members are encouraged to wear their pin to the October meeting. One lucky member will win a door prize.
