



Hope Harbor Home, Brunswick County

Hope Harbor Home is Brunswick County's only program offering around-the-clock response to victimsof domestic violence and their children. Services include a fully staffed safe shelter and crisis hot-line, support groups, victim advocacy, meals, clothing, and transportation. Hope Harbor also employs aCommunity Educator who conducts presentations in schools on issues such as bullying, dating violence, sexual harassment, self-esteem, and other topics aimed at promoting nonviolence among students and throughout the community. During their 30 years of operation, thousands of women and children have found safe shelter and received services through Hope Harbor Home.

Hope Harbor Home Wish List

- Gift Cards (gas stations, drug stores, grocery stores, Walmart)
- Pre-paid mobile phones (help clients communicate with the shelter when they are off the premises)
- Monetary contributions to the Hope Harbor Home Client Emergency Fund helps to provide car repairs, hotel rooms while clients are relocating, school fees for children
- Nonperishable food items (coffee, creamer, sugar and sugar substitutes, tea bags, soda, juice boxes, snacks) new, unopened within use date, please.
- Disposables plates, cups, bowls, forks, spoons, napkins, aluminum foil, plastic wrap, paper towels, bathroom tissue, aluminum pie pans and baking pans all sizes
- Twin sheets, new pillows, bath towels, face clothes
- © Cleaning supplies spray cleaners, bleach, laundry detergents, dishwashing liquid (not for dishwasher)
- Tower the counter medications acetaminophen, ibuprofen, aspirin, Pepto, Tums, etc.
- Feminine products sanitary napkins, tampons, panty liners
- Hair products and makeup include hair products designed for women of color
- Baby care items wipes, baby powder (especially travel sizes), rash creams, baby soap, disposable diapers (especially toddler sizes), disposable training pants, car seat covers

- Underwear, socks, slippers for women and children
- School supplies of all kinds including multi-subject notebooks and backpacks
- © Craft materials latch-hook kits, poster paint, finger paint, cloth and paint for cloth, glitter and glue pens, face paint, molding clay, stickers, washable markers, construction paper
- Spanish language books, movies, and musical videos for children and adults (G-rated)
- DVDs nonviolent G-rated films for children and non-violent Wii games, exercise videos,

entertainment videos, educational videos, inspirational videos

As members of the state Executive Board, presidents will help decide whether to recommend or not recommend adoption of each proposal. The Rules Committee chairman will present the Executive Board's position on each proposal to the membership session prior to the membership's decision to adopt or not to adopt proposed amendments. Our room block at the Wilmington Hilton is full. The Towne Place Suites Wilmington-Wrightsville Beach (a Marriott property) has been announced as the overflow hotel and is offering DKG members rooms for \$119 plus taxes. The same price applies to Thursday for those wanting to come early. The hotel is located at 305 Eastwood Road, Wilmington. The number is 910-332-3326.

The Towne Place Suites WilmingtonWrightsville Beach, offers free parking, WiFi and breakfast. Rooms have two queen beds or a queen bed and sleep sofa. Rooms must be booked by March 27. Eta State NC Executive Secretary Dr. Barbara Perry-Sheldon asks that if you have booked extra rooms at the Hilton that you don't need, please release/cancel them ASAP. Something to think about... As you are

getting ready to attend the Eta State Convention, I know you are making hotel reservations, submitting your registration form, and looking for your beach clothes! But, are you thinking about your homework? Have you read the proposed rules changes? They are posted on our state website and can be accessed from the home page. It's not as scary as it looks! The Rules Committee has done a great job of bundling "like" items together so we can vote on them at one time. Here's a study guide!

- Group I deals with a change in terminology which aligns with the Constitution and does not suggest the process for selecting state personnel; "appointed personnel" changed to "related personnel."
- Goup II identifies the state webmaster as a personnel position with a six year term. The selection process and reimbursement would be comparable to other state personnel.
- Group III offers clarification on several items: state officer positions identified in keeping with the Constitution, a proposed transition meeting for incoming and outgoing state officers, Executive Board action between board meetings, and termination of affiliation with Covenant for North Carolina's Children. Other items include adding two additional members to the Communications and Publicity Committee and making the Rising Star a permanent award.
- Group IV is a mash-up of odds and ends. The rationale for each one is enlightening.

If we all come prepared to take action, the meeting will be productive and move along quickly. Anyone want to finish early?

Members are urged to pay close attention to Legislative and Executive actions at both the state and national levels and to take action when necessary. "Take action" means calling, visiting or writing lawmakers, the governor and/or the president when they are considering laws or mandates that impact students, children or educators. In NC, lawmakers are in Raleigh Tuesday through Thursday, so members who do not live near Raleigh can visit or call their Representative or Senator's home offices on Mondays or Fridays. Get together with fellow sisters and plan a visit today. Another option is to invite a lawmaker, even a local County Commission member, to a chapter meeting for an important Q&A session with prepared questions ready for member use. Stay informed by checking the NC Public Schools First website and the Raleigh News & Observer newspaper. In the near future, the Educational Law &Policy Committee will be conducting the 2017 Educational Issues Survey. Watch for it and be sure to complete the survey of priorities. Until the results of this survey are ready, use the current prioritized list of education issues found at Eta State's website, www.ncdkg.org. Click on Leadership, Committees, then Educational Law & Policy. The whitepaper is the first attachment.
